



Country Coordinating Mechanisms Online Discussions (the “CCM eForum”)

When will it start?

The CCM eforum is scheduled to start in July under a new communications platform called [MyGlobalfund](#) which will be launched in July 2007. The CCM eforum will be one of the first online discussions to run under the new MyGlobalFund platform.

Who is it for?

The CCM eforum is for CCMs themselves, principal recipients, sub recipients, civil society organisations, members of the private sector, development partners and other stakeholders involved in the fight against HIV/AIDS tuberculosis and malaria in grant recipient countries.

Why the CCM eforum?

The CCM is a key part of Global Fund architecture and serves as the central mechanism for proposal and strategy development, harmonization and alignment, implementation and oversight of grants. The forum will be a tool for sharing experiences in implementation of grants and oversight, identification of key issues, challenges that affect CCMs and possible solutions to these. Many CCMs are evolving and at various stages of development hence it is important to facilitate positive evolvment for better grant and country performance.

How can I join?

The CCM e-forum is one of the first online discussions to take place on the new MyGlobalFund website. Anyone who wants to actively participate (posting messages and answering to other postings) will first need to register by following a link on the homepage.

What Language?

It is planned that the CCM e-forum will be moderated by the Secretariat and will be conducted in English, French, Russian and Spanish. Summaries of discussions taking place in one language will be translated into the 3 other ones and reposted in the respective forums to ensure maximum participation of people of all languages.

Discussion Themes/Topics/Questions

At this stage the Global Fund Secretariat is soliciting input for topics, discussion themes or questions that people would like to address in the CCM e-forum. This will ensure that forum participants have a chance to contribute to the agenda issues that are of concern to them and which should be addressed in the forum.
